ALL ABOUT MARY

Homily of His Holiness Pope Francis on the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Daejeon, Korea, 15 August 2014

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In union with the whole Church, we celebrate the Assumption of Our Lady, body and soul, into the glory of heaven. Mary's Assumption shows us our own destiny as God's adoptive children and members of the body of Christ. Like Mary our Mother, we are called to share fully in the Lord's victory over sin and death, and to reign with him in his eternal Kingdom.

The "great sign" presented in today's first reading – a woman clothed in the sun and crowned by stars (cf. Rev 12:1) – invites us to contemplate Mary enthroned in glory beside her divine Son. It also invites us to acknowledge the future which even now the Risen Lord is opening before us. Koreans traditionally celebrate this feast in the light of their historical experience, seeing the loving intercession of Our Lady at work in the history of the nation and the lives of its people.

In today's second reading, we heard Saint Paul tell us that Christ is the new Adam, whose obedience to the Father's will has overturned the reign of sin and bondage and inaugurated the reign of life and freedom (cf. 1 Cor 15:24-25). True freedom is found in our loving embrace of the Father's will. From Mary, full of grace, we learn that Christian freedom is more than liberation from sin. It is freedom for a new, spiritual way of seeing earthly realities. It is the freedom to love God and our brothers and sisters with a pure heart, and to live a life of joyful hope for the coming of Christ's Kingdom.

Today, in venerating Mary, Queen of Heaven, we also turn to her as Mother of the Church. We ask her to help us to be faithful to the royal freedom we received on the day of our Baptism, to guide our efforts to transform the world in accordance with God's plan, and to enable the Church to be ever more fully a leaven of his Kingdom in the midst of His people. May the Christians of this nation be a generous force for spiritual renewal at every level of society. May they combat the allure of a materialism that stifles authentic spiritual and cultural values and the spirit of unbridled competition which generates selfishness and strife. May they also reject inhumane economic models which create new forms of poverty and marginalize workers, and the culture of death which devalues the image of God, the God of life, and violates the dignity of every man, woman and child.

As Catholics, heirs to a noble tradition, you are called to cherish this legacy and transmit it to future generations. This will demand of everyone a renewed conversion to the word of God and a passionate concern for the poor, the needy and the vulnerable in our midst.

In celebrating this feast, we join the Church throughout the world in looking to Mary as our Mother of Hope. Her song of praise reminds us that God never forgets his promise of mercy (cf. Lk 1:54-55). Mary is the one who is blessed because "she believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her by the Lord" (Lk 1:45). In her, all God's promises have been proved trustworthy. Enthroned in glory, she shows us that our hope is real; even now it reaches as "a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul" (Heb 6:19) to where Jesus is seated in glory.

This hope, dear brothers and sisters, the hope held out by the Gospel, is the antidote to the spirit of despair that seems to grow like a cancer in societies which are outwardly affluent, yet often experience inner sadness and emptiness. Upon how many of our young has this despair taken its toll! May they, the young who surround us in these days with their joy and confidence, never be robbed of their hope!

Let us turn to Our Lady and implore the grace to rejoice in the freedom of the children of God, to use that freedom wisely in the service of our brothers and sisters, and to live and work as signs of the hope which will find its fulfilment in that eternal Kingdom where to reign is to serve. Amen.

CHANGE IN PARISH MASS SCHEDULE:

From Tuesday September 1st we shall increase our Masses, to two Masses daily in the parish with a time change for the second mass. The afternoons will help us to accommodate school masses and funerals. Instead of 12:45pm it will be at 7pm, this will encourage more people to consider attending daily masses henceforth.

MONDAY TO FRIDAY: Masses at 9am and 7pm SATURDAYS: Masses at 10am and 6pm SUNDAYS: Masses at 10am, 12 noon, and 6pm

This arrangement is inline with the recommendation that after every mass stewards have to clean the pews and ensure everyone leaves the church before a second gathering of people.

Candidates and Catechumens whose reception of the Sacraments were postponed due to COVID-19 will now receive the sacraments of baptism, first communion and confirmation on Tuesday 8th September - the birthday of our Blessed Mother Mary at 7pm .

NEW GUIDELINES FOR THE WORLD'S PARISHES

On Monday Jul 20, 2020 The Congregation for Clergy on Monday published new guidelines for the world's parishes, which aim to encourage parishes to think of themselves as missionary communities of evangelization. The guideline are 5 points, which we shall publish for the next 5 Sundays in our parish newsletter.

The guidelines are to encourage Catholics to think prayerfully about what their parishes are, and what they are for. Here is the third theme and takeaway:

RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE PARISH MISSION BELONGS TO EVERYONE, BUT EACH HAS A ROLE TO PLAY.

The document emphasizes the co-responsibility of clergy, religious, and laity for the mission of the parish in the world. But the document also emphasizes that each person work for the Kingdom in the role to which he is called by baptism and vocation. The guidelines emphasize that the parish pastor is entrusted with the full "care of souls" in the parish, a role unique to priests.

The document acknowledges a canonical provision that allows lay people to be entrusted with pastoral care in a parish because of a shortage of priests, but emphasizes that such a situation should be rare, and "a temporary and not a permanent measure," that can only be used when there is a true lack of priests.

We are dealing here with an extraordinary form of entrusting pastoral care, due to the impossibility of appointing a Parish Priest or a Parish Administrator, which is not to be confused with the ordinary active cooperation of the lay faithful in assuming their responsibilities."" Furthermore, it would be preferable to appoint one or more deacons over consecrated men and women or laypersons for directing this kind of pastoral care," the guidelines suggest.

The document takes care to urge against the "clericalization of the laity" so frequently warned about by Pope Francis, in which laity are urged to take up roles more typically occupied by priests.

At the same, the document says that laity are called to give their lives to the mission of the Gospel and the work of the Church.


Laity are called "to make a generous commitment to the service of the mission of evangelisation, first of all through the general witness of their daily lives, lived in conformity with the Gospel, in whatever environment they are in and at every level of responsibility; in a particular way, they are called to place themselves at the service of the Parish community."

The guidelines also encourage a vision of deacons as ministers of service, rather than as assistants to parish priests, and of religious men and women as contributors to the evangelizing mission of a parish through the witness of their religious consecration.
